Boots, Burgers and Bikes event set for August

OKEECHOBEE — Big Brothers/Big Sisters will bring back their popular Boots, Burg-ers and Bikes event at the C. Scott Driver Recreation Area on the Kissimmee River on Saturday, Aug. 29.

At their Jan. 8 meeting, the Okeechobee County commissioners agreed to waive the facility use fee for the event.

The county also agreed to allow Big Brothers/Big Šisters to serve beer at the event, as they did last year.

Taylor Farnsworth, of Big Brothers/Big Sisters, said adding the drive-in motorcycle show to the annual Boots and Burgers fundraiser was a big success in 2019.

"It was a huge hit, and we saw big in-crease in net profit," she explained.

The previous years, Boots and Burgers raised around \$5,000 each year. The 2019 Boots, Burgers and Bikes event raised about \$10,000.

All of that money stays in Okeechobee County, she said.

The Scott Driver property offers a wonderful location for the event as well as a nice ride for those who participate in the drive-in bike show, she said.

Local restaurants are invited to have booths at Boots, Bikes and Burgers and compete for the title of best burger. Those in attendance vote for their favorite burger.

The event includes live music.

Ms. Farnsworth said since it is a "drive-in" event, they have a three-beer limit, and issue wrist bands to ensure those served beer are over age 21.

Okeechobee Waterway runs coast to coast

Florida boaters can travel from the east coast to the west coast via the Lake Okeechobee Waterway.

The 154-mile-long waterway extends from the Atlantic Ocean at Stuart to the Gulf of Mexico at Fort Meyers. The waterway runs through Lake Okeechobee and consists of the Caloosahatchee River to the west of the lake and the St. Lucie Canal east of the lake.


Much of the waterway is man-made. Nature did not connect the St. Lucie River to the ocean. The connection between Lake Okeechobee and the St. Lucie is man-made, as is the channel connecting Lake Okeechobee to the Caloosahatchee River. In the days before paved roads, early pioneers used the waterways as liquid highways. Riverboats carried passengers back and forth between rural heartland and the coastal cities. Boats also hauled produce from rural farms to market and supplies back to the interior.

Today, instead of steamships hauling freight the passengers, the Lake Okeechobee Waterway is used for recreational boating and fishing.

There are five locks on the waterway. From east to west they are the St. Lucie Lock, the Port Mayaca Lock, the Moore Haven Lock, the Ortona Lock and the W.P. Franklin Lock.

These locks, operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, are operated 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. The last lockage of the day begins at 4:30 p.m.

Twenty-five bridges cross various points along the Lake Okeechobee Waterway. Eleven of these bridges open for boat traffic. The lowest of the fixed bridges is the Port Mayaca Railroad Bridge with a vertical clearance of 49 feet. Sailboats that are too tall to clear the bridge are sometimes helped under the bridge by means of the "Okeechobee limbo." The website offshoreblue.com explains: "A crew out of the Indiantown Marina will meet your boat at the bridge and by use of plastic 50 gallon drums lined up along your rail and filled with water, list your vessel enough to pass

under the Port Mayaca RR Bridge. Once through, the drums are emptied and removed from your boat and you are on vour wav.

The whole process generally takes less than an hour."

The Okeechobee Waterway is usually open year-round, but during the dry season there are sometimes restrictions based on the depth of the water. Tropical storms and hurricanes can also result in some closures on the waterway.

Hike or bike around Lake Okeechobee's dike

OKEECHOBEE — A visit to the Okeechobee area isn't complete without seeing the Big O, the second largest freshwater lake within the continental United States.

Visitors can enjoy walking, hiking, roll-

erblading, bicycling and horseback riding around Lake Okeechobee. Designated as part of the Florida National Scenic Trail in 1993, the Lake Okeechobee Scenic Trail is an approximately 110-mile trail encircling the lake. More than half of the trail is paved, and the remainder consists of a two-track gravel roadway on top of the 35-foot high Herbert Hoover Dike.

The height above the surrounding area provides hikers, bikers and wildlife watchers with scenic vistas of the lake. The trail is open year-round and can be utilized for short day hikes or loop hikes. There are 14 camping areas available on or adjacent to the trail. Hunting is not permitted on any section of the trail. No fees or permits are required for trail use. Access can be gained from any recreation area located around the lake.

Due to construction on the dike, some areas of the trail may be closed. Before you set out on a hike or bicycle ride, check the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers website at saj.usace.army.mil/Missions/Civil-Works/ Recreation/Lake-Okeechobee-Scenic-Trail/.



Panther spotted north of river

TALLAHASSEE — An adult female Florida panther has been spotted north of the Caloosahatchee River, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission reported Tuesday, Jan. 7.

FWC said the sighting of Florida's state animal north of the Caloosahatchee River is a good sign, as the river has appeared to be a major obstacle to northward movement of female panthers for years.

Four years ago, the FWC documented the first female north of the river in nearly 50 years.

A wildlife underpass on State Road 80 was recently completed by the Florida Department of Transportation, and it is not known whether that might have been the route taken by this particular animal. A trail camera did capture a night image, however. An FWC spokeswoman at the agency's South Region office in West Palm Beach could not provide any more information.

• O.K. Corral Gun Club, 9449 N.E. 48th St., has 29 shooting stations with sporting clay courses, covered 5-stand, wobble deck, covered pistol/rifle ranges, competition shooting park and even an Old West street with cowboy action shooting. The club also hosts a steak dinner every Friday from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. which features live music. • OK Shooting Sports, 7055 N.E. 48th St., has rifle and pistol ranges, with five 5-stand sporting clays fields, trap and skeet fields and shooting galleries.

Duck hunting, hog hunting and alligator hunting are also popular in Okeechobee, with some hunting allowed on public land as well as hunting with permission on private property. For more on Florida hunting seasons, licenses and permits, go online to myfwc.com.
