





She volunteers at her church helping with the children, and also helps in the puppet ministry & Vacation Bible School. Hannah's future plans are to finish her associates degree and then work from home.




Zoe Walther

OHS Class of 2021 overcomes all obstacles

OKEECHOBEE — The Class of 2021 faced because their kids were worth the struggle." a senior year unlike any other.

"I am so very proud of the huge strides

While the Class of 2020 had the second half of their year impacted by COVID-19, they were still able to enjoy a normal first half of the school year, with Homecoming, a bonfire, and many of the other great traditions that every student looks forward to in their senior year.

But seniors in the Okeechobee High School Class of 2021 knew from the get-go that school was going to be different this year

That also applied to teachers and school administrators as well.

With the move to give students the option to attend school in person at the beginning of the year, district staff had to go above and beyond to keep things safe, for both the students and themselves.

"The extra steps that were taken were precautions we were all willing to take in order to have daily access to our students," said OHS principal Lauren Myers. "Teachers had to completely change the way in which

they taught; they were stretched in every way possible, and in the end they did it because their kids were worth the struggle

"I am so very proud of the huge strides we have made this year in learning a new way of work because we did it as a Brahman family," continued Myers. "The amount of experimenting, problem solving, and collaboration that it took to get us to these last few days is nothing short of impressive."

Students adjusted to face masks and daily temperature checks and teachers began cleaning and wiping desks between classes to mitigate the spread. Movement on campus was adjusted and visitors and volunteers were limited. Administrators were thrust into the role of contact tracers, researching seating charts in classes and buses to figure out who might have been exposed to a positive case of the virus. Bus routes and capacity were adjusted, food service meal preparations were overhauled, and custodial cleaning was redefined and intensified. Everyone was affected and everyone played a role in fighting to control the virus.

By the second half of the school year vaccinations started ramping up. Slowly but surely, signs of normalcy started returning again. And, at the district level, conversations started happening about giving 2021 seniors a chance to experience some of the things that the COVID-19 pandemic had taken from them.

"These seniors have lost enough since March of 2020," said Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services Dylan Tedders. "If we could ensure events could occur safely, making them happen became the mission. Lauren Myers, Ken Kenworthy, and all members of the School Board wanted to make it happen-safely. With that mission in mind, the staff at OHS stepped up to meet the challenges and give this outgoing class an ending to remember."

Homecoming, the annual bonfire, and Prom, all the things students assumed had no chance of happening suddenly had a spark of life. Staff at OHS got to work on squeezing a year's worth of activities into a two-month time span.

"Finally being able to hold events where students can be a part of a larger whole

has made all the difference these last two months," explained Myers. "Students need to belong to something that is bigger than the individual. I have had parents reach out to say that they have seen a physical difference in their student just since the first announcement of upcoming events were made. The OHS staff has been incredible; so many have stepped up and filled in where they were needed to pull off events like the traditional bonfire and make the entire Homecoming week happen with only 3 weeks lead time."

"This class has been a small cohort since they entered the 9th grade and they have endured more obstacles in the past 15 months than any class before them," concluded Myers. "They now have become a part of world history, and will be remembered as the class that overcame insurmountable odds on their way to the finish line is the legacy that they leave behind at Okeechobee High School.
